# 24.01.01 Risk Management Programs

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### **Regulation Statement**

The Texas A&M University System (system) strives to manage, control and, where appropriate, reduce or eliminate risk to its employees, students and visitors, its financial condition, and its material and natural resources. Risk management programs support this goal by establishing program guidelines that expand upon system policy and state and federal statutes and regulations.

## **Reason for Regulation**

While members are responsible for being in compliance with System Policy 24.01, Risk Management, and with state and federal risk management rules and statutes, additional risk management programs and/or administrative procedures that exceed or expand upon these requirements may be adopted by the system in order to form a more comprehensive risk management framework.

# **Procedures and Responsibilities**

Members are required to have programs in each the following areas when and where potential risk has been identified.

  - Agriculture and Forestry Safety
  - Biological Safety
  - Chemical Safety
  - Employee Safety Responsibility
  - Fire and Life Safety
  - General Safety

  - Laboratory Safety and Health Management
  - Management of Thermal Stress
  - Mobile Equipment
  - Operation of Heavy Equipment

- Radiation Safety
- Reproductive Risks
- Respiratory Protection
- Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS)
- Use of Personal Protective Equipment
- Ventilation Control for Occupational Health
- Visitor Safety
